the points become stars

bamboo skewers, hot glue, nylon fiber, string, wood, steel, paper, unfired clay, sand, latex, mirror, chair, 129" x 84" x 69", 2010

Made mostly of bamboo skewers wrapped in a mixture of clay, paint, and paper pulp *the points become stars* becomes an altar for the viewer. As the viewer approaches the chair their reflection becomes visible in the mirror hanging from the structure. At that moment a reflection of a skull painted under the seat of the chair becomes visible in a second mirror the chair sits on.

The painting is mostly abstract but has symbols, images and words imbedded in the layers. The title refers to ideas and events that were happening in my life as the painting was completed.

the sun and its parts

earthenware, wood, casters, paper, acrylic, foam, string, dimensions variable, 2008 *the sun and its parts* is an installation designed to question the relationship of disparate objects.

up from the down low

earthenware, acrylic on paper on panel, 60" x 24" x 16", 2009 *up from the down low* is a work created by layering an image over an abstract painting. Windows through the image allow access to the world beneath. This dimension is governed by unfamiliar rules. The temple and ritualistic vessel are devices used to communicate with a world beyond our own.
